The phrase "credit union" is sometimes shortened to CU. See how many words beginning with the letters CU you can make by filling in the missing letters.



- Fold in the 4 corners so each triangle corner touches the center.




4. Flip it so the picture is facing up.5. Fold in the 4 corners again.




